


# House Republican Alliance Recommendation Sheet

For November 16, 2005 House Session

The purpose of the House Republican Alliance is to preserve and strengthen the traditional principles and values of the Republican Party through the NH House of Representatives and throughout the state of NH, including fiscal restraint, personal freedom and responsibility, small government, free enterprise and strong families. We offer the following recommendations based on those principles, the Republican Party Platform and the NH and Federal Constitutions.



## REGULAR CALENDAR

### LSR-05-1083

The Republican party platform preamble states that we are united by... “Our compassion for the truly needy.” Part II of the party platform states that among “ the foremost convictions that distinguish our Party in New Hampshire are...Promoting a limited government that is open, responsive and fully accountable to and in touch with its citizens.”

If ever we are to be responsive to and in touch with the citizens of New Hampshire it is now and with the issue of exorbitant heating and energy costs. This bill will help those truly in need, those who would be without heat and left in the cold due to circumstances beyond their control. This bill prioritizes and fully utilizes the existing programs currently offered to ease an imminent if not immediate energy issue.

Along with the short term solution to the energy cost crisis and one’s limited ability to pay those costs, the NHHRA is pleased that also included in this bill (at the time of this writing) is the creation of an assistance program review committee that will be formed to look at this issue and the entire heating subsidy and energy efficiency program. We support the emergency home heating assistance bill and finding a long term solution to make people more independent, responsible and self reliant. **Recommendation Support Ought To Pass**

### *NHHRA LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES for 2006 House Session*

*The New Hampshire House Republican Alliance has elected to encourage and support the following initiatives consistent with the principles and ideals of New Hampshire’s Republican Party Platform and has introduced LSR’s as the first step towards make those initiatives a reality.*

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY:**

***1. Interdicting employment of illegal aliens.***

***2. Resolving Illegal Alien Trespass in New Hampshire statutes.***

***3. Establishing a study of New Hampshire laws and procedures having to do with enhancing prosecution and removal from society of those who would sexually prey on minors.***

**2006-H-2102-R** relative to the prohibition on employment of illegal aliens.

**2006-H-2104-R** relative to criminal penalties and forfeiture for activities in support of illegal immigration.

**2006-H-2053**-relative to criminal trespass.

**2006-H-2360-R** prohibiting the use of false documentation for employment, government services, or permits.

**2006-H-2362-R** authorizing a memorandum of understanding between state and local law enforcement and the United States Department of Homeland Security regarding immigration enforcement and making an appropriation therefor .

## **TAXATION:**

*1. Amending the New Hampshire Constitution to permanently prohibit taxing of personal income.*

*2. Returning all state surplus back to New Hampshire taxpayers.*

**2006-H-2060-R** relating to prohibiting an income tax. Providing that no tax on personal income shall be levied by the state of New Hampshire.

**2006-H-2200-R** relative to the use of excess state revenues .

**2006-H-2200-R** relative to the use of excess state revenues .

## **PROPERTY RIGHTS:**

*1. Clarifying State statutes to prohibit the taking of private property for any purpose other than public use.*

*2. Preparing Resolution to New Hampshire's Congressional Delegation in support of amending the United States Constitution to prohibit the taking of private property for any purpose but public use - and including the amending language.*

*3. Amending the New Hampshire Constitution to permanently prohibit the taking of private property for any purpose but public use.*

**2006-H-2045-R** relative to eminent domain.

**2006-H-2642-R** encouraging the United States Congress to propose an amendment to the constitution concerning eminent domain

**2006-H-2232-R** relating to establishing limits on the taking of private property. Providing that private property can only be taken for a public use.

## **EFFICIENCY AND SPENDING:**

*1. Providing for the review and sun setting of state agencies.*

*2. Requiring Zero Based Budgeting for all state agencies.*

*3. Requiring that the burden of funding and the management of qualifications for Special Education be removed from the purview of local school districts and assumed by the State of New Hampshire.*

**2006-H-2064-R** establishing a sunset review process for executive agency and judicial programs and making an appropriation therefor .

**2006-H-2527-R** relative to standardizing the format for special education budgets .

**2006-H-2848-R** establishing a commission relative to special education funding .

## **EDUCATION:**

*1. Enhancing the opportunity for school choice and for school vouchers in New Hampshire.*

*2. Teaching Firearms safety in schools.*

**2006-H-2138-R** establishing a school choice certificate program.

**2006-H-2094-R** relative to firearms safety education in public schools.

## **LIABILITY AND TORTS:**

*1. Providing immunity for employers from consequences having to do with employees bringing firearms on the site of their employment.*

**2006-H-2556-R** relative to firearms in locked vehicles.

## **ELECTION REFORM:**

*1. Requiring 3 year appointment terms in lieu of 5 year appointment terms of appointments for state department heads etc.*

**2006-H-2291-R** relative to terms of office for all state department commissioners.
