The HRA Pink Sheets contain analysis and recommendations for or against legislation based on its conformity to the NH Republican Party Platform and the US and NH Constitutions as determined by a consensus of HRA members.

- 6 Oppose Rule 63d forbids anyone carrying a deadly weapon, openly or concealed, in the House chamber or gallery.
NH Constitution, Article 2-a: "All persons have the right to keep and bear arms in defense of themselves, their families, their property and the state."
- 7 Oppose Rule 67d requiring all Representatives to attend sensitivity training for sexual harassment.
NH Constitution, Article 22, empowers the House to "settle rules of proceedings." This new rule has nothing to do with rules of proceedings and is thus not constitutional.
- 13 Oppose ITL HB282 relative to the authority of fish and game officers to search without a warrant.
NH Constitution, Article 19, requires a warrant based on probable cause for all searches.
- 14 Oppose OTP HB349 relative to a second opinion on health care matters for state and county prisoners.
This would be an unfunded mandate on local jails, forbidden by the NH Constitution, section 28-a.
- 15 Oppose ITL HB124 repealing the law relative to the buffer zones to reproductive health care facilities.
The Federal Constitution, Amendment 1, guarantees free speech.
- 17 Oppose OTP HB120 regulating body art establishments and massage, reflexology, structural integrator and other establishments.
Platform: "Minimize business regulations, permits, licenses."
- 19 Oppose ITL HB333 relative to mental health professionals in private custody matters.
